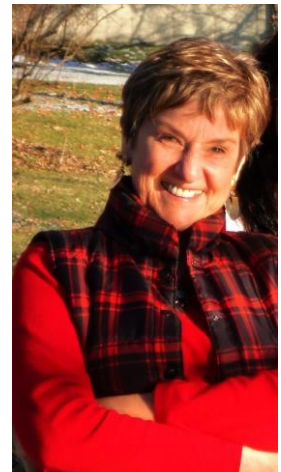

Learn about sustainable farming at the Cable Community Farm. The tour will feature the Community Garden, Growing Together Garden, Native Plant Pollinator Garden, Theatre Flowers Garden, Community Chicken Coop, and Community Orchard, Community Vineyard. All of the garden spaces are naturally grown, using organic methods. We will also take a hike on the one-mile “Nature’s Garden” trail that features over 30 “wild edibles” and check out the community bee hive and the Little Farmers play area. This tour will be informative and fun for all ages!

Farmer Aaron Campbell has been farming at the Cable Community Farm since it was founded in 2013. The farming methods, modeled after Joel Salatin’s Polyface Farm, make use of the systems found in nature to raise livestock using environmentally responsible, ecologically beneficial, and sustainable agricultural practices. Farmer Aaron is raising Cornish X broilers and Pekin ducks as a local source of protein for the Cable community this summer and he also runs the Community Chicken Coop and the mobile hen house, where laying hens provide eggs for the community.
